# Heating/Cooling Centers

## Get out of the Heat/Cold



Exposure to extreme heat/cold can be life threatening. Learn how to stay cool/warm when there is no electricity.

### What is a Heating/Cooling Center?

Heating/Cooling Centers is a temporary air-conditioned or heated public space set up by localities as a service to the community to deal with health effects of a heat wave or extreme cold in the event of power outages. The Heating/Cooling Centers are not intended to be shelters for over-night stays. A decision will be made by Emergency Management when the centers will be available.

Please monitor the local media for the location of the Heating/Cooling Centers that will be opened.



### Can I go to a Heating/Cooling Center?

Yes, Heating/Cooling Centers are for everyone, especially those at risk of getting a heat/cold related illness:

Heating/Cooling

Senior Citizens

People with medical condition

People with a disability

Infants and young children

## Be Safe in the Heat/Cold

When visiting a Heating/Cooling Center, please bring any medications and/or specialty items that you need. Transportation and food will not be provided. Usually ice, bottled water and power will be available. Power will also be available to individuals in need of electricity to operate medical devices. These Centers are equipped with generators.

### Learn about Heating /Cooling Centers

Heating / Cooling Centers are opened by localities. This enables the jurisdictions to send out press and media releases of times and which Heating and Cooling Centers will be designated to be opened.

No pets, alcohol or weapons will be allowed.

A designated Center will be for short term stays to allow public to have a place to go that has heat, air conditioning, utilities and rest rooms.

Food is not provided and citizens will need to bring their own snacks, food or other necessities.
